



DelBene WA-01 Project Funding

President Biden signed fiscal year 2024 funding legislation, which included nearly \$18M for 15 community projects across Washington's 1st Congressional District that were championed by Congresswoman Suzan DelBene (WA-01).

SR-531 Trail (City of Arlington)

\$1,000,000

This project will build a multi-use trail to provide a safe pathway for pedestrians and bicyclists.

City of Bellevue Police Department Body-worn Camera Program (City of Bellevue)

\$963,000

This project will help increase accountability and transparency between police officers and members of the Bellevue community.

Electric Engines & Charging (Cities of Bellevue and Redmond)

\$1,000,000

This project supports the Cities of Bellevue and Redmond in acquiring two electric fire engines and associated charging infrastructure.

Woodcrest Utility Replacement Project (City of Bothell)

\$959,752

This project will modernize failing water utilities in the Woodcrest neighborhood.

Swamp Creek Tributary Culvert Replacement Project (City of Kenmore)

\$1,300,000

This project replaces a culvert that is currently blocking the passage of migrating salmon and other fisheries.

Cedarwood Community Recreation Center (City of Lake Stevens):

\$1,366,279

This project will help families access healthy before and after school care, flexible meeting and/or classroom space, and remove blight from the surrounding area in Lake Stevens.

Grove Street Overcrossing (City of Marysville)

\$850,000

This project will construct an overcrossing that would span the existing at-grade crossing, providing congestion relief and improving safety.



DelBene WA-01 Project Funding

Main Street Revitalization Project (City of Mountlake Terrace)

\$850,000

The project will redevelop the downtown infrastructure necessary to facilitate dense housing within the watershed of the Sound Transit light rail station opening later this year.

AC Water Main Replacement (City of Redmond):

\$959,752

This project will replace an asbestos cement water pipe that has reached the end of its useful life.

Staff Little Bear Creek Culvert Replacement Project (City of Woodinville):

\$850,000

This project will replace a culvert and restore fish habitat within Little Bear Creek.

Staff NWIRC Innovation Center Network (Northwest Innovation Resource Center)

\$850,000

This project will establish an innovation center in Arlington to help entrepreneurs and small businesses explore new technologies and remain competitive.

Chinook Marsh (Snohomish County)

\$959,752

This project will restore approximately 430 acres of tidal habitat benefiting Endangered Species Act-listed Chinook Salmon and relocate a drinking water transmission line.

Food & Farming Center (Snohomish County)

\$5,000,000

This funding will complete the processing, aggregation, and distribution center portion of the Snohomish County Food and Farming Center.

Ash Way Station (Sound Transit)

\$500,000

This project will provide funds for the design of the Ash Way Station, which is part of the Everett Link Extension.

SR-530 Roundabout (Stillaguamish Tribe)

\$500,000 a

This project will construct a roundabout at the SR-530 & Smokey Point Blvd in Arlington, WA.
