Earlier this week, [Grants.gov](#) announced that it will be undergoing a system-wide maintenance update from January 21-25, 2023. They will be changing the process for [Electronic-Business Point of Contact](#)

[\(EBiz POC\)](#) to include a more secure multi-factor authentication and allow users to choose their username or use an already existing applicant account. During that time, the website will not be fully usable.

White House Guidebook: [Inflation Reduction Act – Clean Energy](#)

In December 2022, the White House released “Building a Clean Energy Economy: A Guidebook to the Inflation Reduction Act’s Investments in Clean Energy and Climate Action,” which provides an overview of tax law incentives and funding programs in the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) so that everyone from individuals to state governments can fully benefit from the law. Funding Spotlight: [RAISE Program Grants](#)

Last month the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) published a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the \$1.5 billion Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) grant program. The [RAISE program](#) (formerly known as TIGER and BUILD) was expanded last year within the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act – an historic investment to repair and modernize crumbling and outdate infrastructure across America.

IN 2022, RAISE funded 166 projects in all fifty states and U.S. territories. Examples of recent successful local RAISE projects include Whatcom County’s Lummi Island Ferry, the City of Bothell’s Bothell Way NE/Bothell-Everett Highway Multi-Modal Improvement project, the City of Lynnwood’s Poplar Way Bridge Project. Like last year, USDOT encourages applicants to consider how projects demonstrate address climate change, ensure racial equity, remove opportunity barriers, and support and/or create good paying jobs.

Application deadline is 11:59pm EST/8:59pm PST February 28, 2023. Selections will be made and announced no later than June 28, 2023. Broadband & Cybersecurity Infrastructure

[Distance Learning & Telemedicine Grants \(Dept. of Agriculture\)](#)

Info: Program supports the use of telecommunications-enabled information, audio and video equipment, and related advanced technologies by students, teachers, medical professionals, and rural residents. These grants are intended to increase rural access to education, training, and health care resources that are otherwise unavailable or limited in scope.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, small businesses and for profit entities, institutions of higher education, nonprofit organizations

Closing: January 30, 2023

[Cybersecurity Innovation for Cyberinfrastructure \(CICI\) \(National Science Foundation\)](#)

Info: This program seeks to advance scientific discovery and innovation by enhancing the security and privacy of cyberinfrastructure. CICI supports efforts to develop, deploy and integrate cybersecurity that will benefit the broader scientific community by securing science data, computation, collaborations workflows, and infrastructure. CICI recognizes the unique nature of modern, complex, data-driven,

distributed, rapid, and collaborative science and the breadth of infrastructure and requirements across scientific disciplines, practitioners, researchers, and projects. CICI seeks proposals in three program areas: 1) usable and collaborative security for science, 2) reference scientific security datasets, 3) transition in cybersecurity resilience.

Applicants: nonprofit organizations, independent museums, observatories, research labs, professional societies, institutions of higher education

Closing: February 17, 2023

Climate, Conservation & Environment

[Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities \(BRIC\)](#) (Federal Emergency Management Agency)

Info: The Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) program is for pre-disaster mitigation activities. It has a general focus on disasters, risks, and hazards, including those associated with climate change.

Applicants: States, Tribal governments, and territories may submit applications on behalf of subapplicants that include: local governments, emergency management and planning offices

Closing: January 27, 2023

[Flood Mitigation Assistance Program](#) (Federal Emergency Management Agency)

Info: The purpose of this grant program is to reduce or eliminate the risk of repetitive flood damage to buildings and structures insured under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). Includes both acute extreme weather events and chronic stressors which have been observed and are expected to increase in intensity and frequency in the future.

Applicants: States, Tribal governments, and territories may submit applications on behalf of subapplicants that include: local governments, planning and emergency management and planning offices

Closing: January 27, 2023

[High-Priority Regional Invasive Species - Non Federal Lands](#) (Dept. Of Agriculture)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act

Info: Strategically sustains the health of the forest ecosystems and tree species with high ecological value by taking stronger action in the early phases of the invasion curve at regional or sub-regional scales and at points of entry to collaboratively scale-up the implementation of management actions which will prevent the introduction and spread of harmful invasive species.

Applicants: State governments, nonprofit organizations, and institutions of higher education

Closing: February 3, 2023

[Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Fund](#) (National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act

Info: Program will support state and tribal programs for salmon restoration by allocating federal funding to projects and activities that provide demonstrable and measurable benefits to Pacific anadromous salmonids (i.e., Chinook salmon, coho salmon, chum salmon, sockeye salmon, pink salmon and steelhead) and their habitat.

Applicants: Western states and Tribal governments

Closing: March 6, 2023

[OR/WA Invasive and Noxious Plant Management](#) (Dept. of the Interior)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act

Info: Program works to prevent, detect, inventory, control, and monitor weed populations on public lands.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, nonprofit organizations, institutions of higher education, public housing agencies

Closing: March 16, 2023

[Climate and Societal Interactions](#) (Dept. of Commerce)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act

Info: Program supports collaborative research and community engagement projects that improve climate adaptation planning and action. Collaborative research and community engagement are defined as the process of developing trusted and sustained partnerships between scientists, decision-makers, and communities that lead to shared understandings of climate adaptation needs and the co-generation of credible and actionable climate knowledge to support community defined plans, including implementable solutions. Outcomes from this work will support and inform the identification of equitable and inclusive infrastructure investments that mitigate flooding and wildfire risks.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, nonprofit organizations, institutions of higher education, commercial organizations

Closing: March 29, 2023

[Prescott Marine Mammal Rescue Assistance](#) (U.S. Fish & Wildlife)

Info: Provides financial assistance to eligible marine mammal stranding participants to support all aspects of response (i.e., retrieval, care, treatment, rehabilitation, and release, as appropriate) to the stranding of certain marine mammals and for related scientific research. Successful applications will be those aimed at helping support these actions.

Closing: March 30, 2023

[Bycatch Reduction Engineering Program](#) (National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration)

Info: The mission of the National Bycatch Reduction Engineering Program (BREP) is to support the development of technological solutions and changes in fishing practices designed to minimize bycatch of fish and protected species and to reduce impacts to invertebrates.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, nonprofits, small businesses and other for profit organizations, institutions of higher education, individuals, nonprofits

Closing: April 3, 2023

[Environmental Justice Collaborative Agreement Program](#) (Environmental Protection Agency)

Info: Program seeks to support community-based organizations in collaborating and partnering with other stakeholders to develop solutions that will significantly address environmental and/or public health issue(s) in communities disproportionately burdened by environmental harms and risks.

Applicants: Nonprofit organizations

Closing: April 10, 2023

[ORWA Plant Conservation & Restoration Management](#) (Bureau of Land Management - BLM)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act

Info: Program activities include but are not limited to supporting habitat management to restore keystone pollinators and rare wildlife, development of genetically appropriate native plant material, pollinator research, increasing understanding of rare plant biology, and more.

Applicants: Local, state and Tribal governments, public and Tribal housing agencies, nonprofit organizations, institutions of higher education, independent school districts

Closing: April 14

[Oregon/Washington Forest & Woodlands Resource Management](#) (Bureau of Land Management - BLM)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act

Info: A primary activity of the program is to maintain and improve the resilience of forest and woodland ecosystems to wildfire, insects, disease, and drought through density management using timber sales, Stewardship agreements, and other agreements. Funded projects under this program will focus on high priority work such as activities that promote forest and woodland health, sustainable forest management, fire resiliency, biomass utilization for bioenergy, habitat conservation needs, and insect, disease and fire recovery. These activities could include, but are not limited to: planting trees, pre-commercial and commercial thinning, salvage/sanitation forest treatments, control of competing vegetation, fuels reduction, riparian or upland restoration, project development and layout, planning analysis and document preparation needed in concert with or to carry out Land Use Planning Decisions, Endangered Species Act or cultural clearances, data collection, and monitoring.

Applicants: Local, state and Tribal governments, public and Tribal housing agencies, nonprofit organizations, institutions of higher education in Oregon or Washington state

Closing: April 14, 2023

[Oregon/Washington Recreation & Visitor Services](#) (Bureau of Land Management - BLM)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act

Info: Program provides a wide variety of recreational opportunities that benefit the public and local communities, including but limited to enhancing access to BLM public lands and waters and recreations opportunities, enrichment of visitor services, expanding access for people with disabilities, improving community-based partnerships for tourism and conservation, messaging development, and more.

Applicants: Local, state and Tribal governments, nonprofit organizations, institutions of higher education, public and Tribal housing agencies, independent school districts in Oregon or Washington state

Closing: April 21, 2023

[Oregon/Washington Fisheries & Aquatic Resources Management](#) (Bureau of Land Management - BLM)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act

Info: Program conserves and restores riparian, fisheries, and water resources to provide resource values and ecosystem services necessary to achieve the BLM's multiple use mandate. Priority areas include decision support, conservation, restoration, sustainability, and collaboration.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, public and Tribal housing agencies, nonprofit

organizations, institutions of higher education in Oregon and Washington state

Closing: April 19, 2023

Refuges Enhancement/Infrastructure (Dept. of the Interior)

Info: The goals of the initiative are to enable local communities to play a more active role in increasing outdoor recreation opportunities on refuge lands and waters, to be more focused and deliberate in using partnerships to help FWS address infrastructure repair and improvement needs such as proactive maintenance and the maintenance backlog, and to enhance wildlife habitat. Successful projects will be related to identified FWS priorities or infrastructure projects at national wildlife refuges that enhance the visitor experience, promote wildlife-dependent outdoor recreation, provide sustainable wildlife habitat, provide career training and mentoring opportunities, and engage the community in opportunities to participate in wildlife-dependent outdoor recreation on FWS lands and waters.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, institutions of higher education, small businesses, nonprofit organizations

Closing: September 10, 2023

Refuges Enhancement/Non-Infrastructure (Dept. of Interior)

Info: The program encourages National Wildlife Refuge System field stations to partner with local, regional, and national nonprofit organizations, other land management groups, state and tribal partners, and others to accomplish projects that promote the stewardship of resources of the refuge through habitat maintenance, restoration, and improvement, biological monitoring, or research; increase awareness and understanding of the refuge and the National Wildlife Refuge System through the development, publication, or distribution of educational materials and products; advance education concerning the purposes of the refuge and the mission of the National Wildlife Refuge System through the use of the refuge as an outdoor classroom to combine educational curricula with the personal experiences of students relating to fish, wildlife, and plants and their habitat and to the cultural and historical resources of the refuges and development of other educational programs; promote the understanding of, education relating to, and the conservation of the fish, wildlife, plants, and cultural and historical resources; improve scientific literacy.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, institutions of higher education, small businesses, nonprofit organizations

Closing: September 10, 2023

Candidate Species Conservation Fund (U.S. Fish & Wildlife)

Info: Program provides Federal financial assistance on a competitive basis to states, landowners, educators, non-profit organizations, researchers and other potential partners to secure information about candidate and other at-risk species to avert listing of species pursuant to the Endangered Species Act, and to help conserve the ecosystems upon which these species depend. Species eligible for this funding opportunity include both candidate and at-risk species. Priority will be given to projects that aid in improving the conservation status of a species so as to preclude the need to list. These projects could include, but are not limited to, activities that will secure scientific information about candidate or at-risk species and their habitat, implement restoration actions that will lead to removing threats to the species, or help prevent extinction of a species.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, nonprofit organizations, housing authorities,

independent school districts, institutions of higher education, small businesses and other for profit institutions, individuals

Closing: September 30, 2023

Education, Humanities & Arts

Digital Humanities Advancement (National Endowment for the Humanities)

Info: Program supports innovative, experimental and/or computationally challenging digital projects leading to work that can scale to enhance scholarly research, teaching, and/or public programming in the humanities.

Applicants: State, local, special district, and Tribal governments, institutions of higher education, nonprofit organizations

Closing: January 22, 2023

Safe & Supportive Schools: Mental Health Service Professional Demonstration Grant (Dept. of Education)

Info: The MHSP Program provides competitive grants to support and demonstrate innovative partnerships to train school-based mental health services providers for employment in schools and local educational agencies (LEAs). The goal of this program is to increase the number and diversity of high-quality, trained providers available to address the shortages of mental health service professionals in schools served by high-need LEAs.

Applicants: High need local education authorities

Closing: January 27, 2023

Computer Science for All (National Science Foundation)

Info: This program aims to provide all U.S. students with the opportunity to participate in computer science and computational thinking education in their schools spanning grades Pre-K-12 via 1) providing high school teachers with preparation and professional development support, 2) providing Pre-K-8th grade teachers with the instructional materials they need to integrate CS and CT into their teaching; and 3) providing schools and districts with resources they need to define and evaluate multigrade pathways into CS and CT.

Applicants: Schools and school districts

Closing: February 8, 2023

Grants for Arts Projects (National Endowment for the Arts)

Info: Grants for Arts Projects is the National Endowment for the Arts' largest grants program for organizations, providing comprehensive and expansive funding opportunities for communities. Through project-based funding, the program supports opportunities for public engagement with the arts and arts education, for the integration of the arts with strategies promoting the health and well-being of people and communities, and for the improvement of overall capacity and capabilities within the arts sector.

Applicants: State, local, and Tribal governments, nonprofit organizations, independent school districts, institutions of higher education

Closing: February 9, 2023

Pacific Northwest Bay Watershed Education and Training (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration)

Info: The Pacific Northwest Bay Watershed Education and Training (B-WET) program is an environmental education program that supports locally relevant, authentic experiential learning in the K-12 environment. Funded projects provide Meaningful Watershed Educational Experiences (MWEEs; defined below) for students, related professional development for teachers, and help to support regional education and environmental priorities in the Pacific Northwest. These programs engage youth in MWEEs that provide memorable hands-on, experiential learning that are not typically available within traditional classrooms. It also plays a significant role in providing professional development. The FY23 Pacific Northwest B-WET funding announcement focuses on the following priority areas: 1) systemic classroom-integrated Meaningful Watershed Educational Experiences (MWEEs) for K-12 students that promote climate resilience and include high-quality teacher professional development related to the MWEEs and 2) Meaningful Watershed Educational Experiences (MWEEs) for K-12 students that appropriately incorporate Indigenous Traditional Ecological Knowledge and promote climate resilience.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, nonprofit organizations, public institutions of higher education

Closing: February 27, 2023

[Educational Technology, Media and Materials for Individuals with Disabilities](#) (Dept. Of Education)

Info: The purpose of the Educational Technology, Media, and Materials for Individuals with Disabilities Program (ETechM2 Program) is to improve results for children with disabilities by 1) promoting the development, demonstration, and use of technology; 2) supporting educational activities designed to be of educational value in the classroom for children with disabilities; 3) providing support for captioning and video description that is appropriate for use in the classroom; and 4) providing accessible educational materials to children with disabilities in a timely manner.

Applicants: Local, state and Tribal governments, institutions of higher education, nonprofits, for profit entities, independent school districts

Closing: March 6, 2023

[Research Grants in the Arts](#) (National Endowment of the Arts)

Info: Program supports research studies that investigate the value and/or impact of the arts, either as individual components of the U.S. arts ecology or as they interact with each other and/or with other domains of American life. The four research areas are: 1) the art's impact on health, education and/or the economy, 2) the art's role in community transformation and healing, 3) diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility in the arts, and 4) the evolving ecosystem of the arts in the US.

Applicants: Local, state and Tribal governments, nonprofit organizations, institutions of higher education, independent school districts

Closing: March 27, 2023

[Native American Library Services Enhancement Grants](#) (Institute of Museum & Library Services)

Info: Program is designed to assist Native American Tribes in improving core library services to their communities, including 1) Improving digital services to support needs for education, workforce development, economic and business development, health information, critical thinking skills, and digital literacy skills; 2) Improving educational programs related to specific topics and content areas of interest to library patrons and community-based users; and/or 3) enhancing the preservation and revitalization of Native American cultures and languages.

Applicants: Tribes

Closing: April 3, 2023

Challenge America (National Endowment for the Arts)

Info: Challenge America offers support primarily to small organizations for projects in all artistic disciplines that extend the reach of the arts to groups/communities with rich and dynamic artistic and cultural contributions to share that are underserved. Challenge America seeks to address these potential barriers for organizations seeking funding. The program features an abbreviated application, a standardized \$10,000 grant amount, and a robust structure of technical assistance to facilitate entry to NEA funding opportunities. This category may be a good entry point for organizations that are new to applying for federal funding.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, nonprofit organizations, institutions of higher education, independent school districts

Closing: April 27, 2023

Ethnic Community Self-Help Program (Dept. of Health and Human Services)

Info: The goal of this program is to support refugee populations in better assimilating into American society and culture by 1) strengthening culturally and linguistically appropriate services to refugees within five years after initial resettlement 2) supporting organizational development and engagement in capacity building by encouraging collaboration with established refugee service providers and mainstream organizations and 3) to supporting promotion of community building and civic participation by refugee individuals and refugee community members.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, public housing agencies, institutions of higher education, nonprofit organizations, independent school districts

Closing: May 21, 2023

Energy

Clean Energy Deployment on Tribal Lands (Dept. Of Energy)

Info: For Tribal governments and organizations to install clean energy generating systems and energy efficiency measures for Tribal buildings, deploy community-scale clean energy generating systems or energy storage on Tribal lands, and/or install integrated energy systems for autonomous operations to power a single or multiple essential tribal facilities during emergency situations or for tribal community resilience.

Applicants: Tribal governments and organizations

Closing: February 9, 2023

Energy Efficiency & Conservation Block Grant Program (Dept. Of Energy)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act

Info: Program makes \$430 million in formula grants available for clean energy projects and programs in local communities.

Applicants: Local, state and Tribal governments

Closing: April 28, 2023

Cleaner Cooking & Reducing Household Energy Emissions (Environmental Protection Agency)

Info: Program seeks to improve climate, environment, health, gender, and livelihoods by reducing

emissions in low-to-middle income countries from household energy use (home cooking, heating, and lighting) and promoting the sustained use of clean and cleaner technologies and fuels.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, hospitals, laboratories, nonprofit organizations, institutions of higher education

Closing: February 28, 2023

Long-Duration Energy Storage Demonstrations (Dept. Of Energy)

Info: The U.S. Dept. of Energy is soliciting emerging Long-Duration Energy Storage (LDES) demonstration projects capable of delivering electricity for 10-24 hours or longer to support low-cost, reliable, carbon-free electric grid. Demonstration projects will be expected to carry out meaningful community and labor engagement, invest in America's workforce by creating good paying jobs, advance DEI, and contribute to President Biden's Justice40 Initiative.

Closing: March 3, 2023

Building Codes Implementation for Efficiency & Resilience Program (Dept. Of Energy)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act

Info: \$45 million in competitive grants to help states and partnering organizations implement updated building energy codes and lower energy bills for American families and businesses.

Applicants: State and local governments

Closing: March

Renewable Energy Systems & Energy Efficiency Improvement Guaranteed Loans & Grants Program (Dept. of Agriculture)

Info: The program provides guaranteed loan financing and grant funding to agricultural producers and rural small businesses for renewable energy systems or to make energy efficiency improvements.

Agricultural producers may also apply for new energy efficient equipment and new system loans for agricultural production and processing. This includes projects such as biomass, geothermal electric generation or direct use, hydropower below 30 megawatts, hydrogen, small and large wind generation, small and large solar generation, ocean generation, and purchasing, installation, and construction of energy efficiency improvements, including HVAC, insulation, lighting, cooling/refrigeration units, doors/windows, electric/solar/gravity pumps, switching from diesel to electric irrigation, replacement of energy-inefficient equipment.

Applicants: Agricultural producers with at least 50% of gross income coming from agricultural operations and eligible small businesses in rural areas

Closing: April 1, 2023

Energy Improvements at Public K-12 Schools (Dept. of Energy)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act – Renew America's Schools

Info: This program support projects that enable replicable and scalable impacts, create innovative, sustaining partnerships, leverage funding and economies of scale, focus on disadvantaged communities, improve student, teacher, and occupant health, enrich learning and growth, assist schools that serve as community assets and are crafted thoughtfully within the context of public school facilities. Topic areas include: 1) High-impact energy efficient and health improvements and 2) innovative energy technology

packages.

Closing: April 21, 2023

Healthier Communities

[Distance Learning & Telemedicine Grants](#) (Dept. of Agriculture)

Info: Program supports the use of telecommunications-enabled information, audio and video equipment, and related advanced technologies by students, teachers, medical professionals, and rural residents. These grants are intended to increase rural access to education, training, and health care resources that are otherwise unavailable or limited in scope.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, small businesses and for profit entities, institutions of higher education, nonprofit organizations

Closing: January 30, 2023

[Senior Medicare Patrol State Project Grants](#) (Dept. of Health and Human Services)

Info: The goal of this program is to empower and assist Medicare beneficiaries, their families, and caregivers to prevent, detect, and report health care fraud, errors, and abuse. Through outreach, counseling, and education, the SMP program increases awareness and understanding of health care programs to protect Medicare beneficiaries from the economic and health-related consequences associated with Medicare fraud, errors, and abuse.

Applicants: Local, state, and Tribal governments, small businesses and for profit institutions, nonprofit organizations, institutions of higher education

Closing: February 15, 2023

[Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health \(REACH\)](#) (Centers for Disease Control)

Info: This five-year program is to improve health, prevent chronic diseases, and reduce health disparities among racial and ethnic populations with the highest risk, or burden, of chronic disease, specifically for African Americans/Blacks, Hispanic Americans, Asian Americans, Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islanders, American Indians, and Alaska Natives.

Applicants: Local, state, Tribal, and special district governments, small businesses, public housing agencies, independent school districts, colleges, and universities

Closing: March 13, 2023

[Grants for the Benefit of Homeless Individuals](#) (Dept. of Health & Human Services)

Info: The purpose of this program is to provide comprehensive, coordinated, and evidence-based treatment and services for individuals, including youth, and families struggling with substance use disorders (SUDs)and/ or co-occurring mental health conditions who are experiencing homelessness.

Applicants: Nonprofit organizations

Closing: April 18, 2023

Info: The purpose of this program is to provide comprehensive, coordinated, and evidence-based treatment and services for individuals, including youth, and families struggling with substance use disorders (SUDs) and/or co-occurring mental health conditions who are experiencing homelessness.

Applicants: Nonprofit organizations

Justice & Public Safety

Grants for Outreach & Services to Underserved Populations (Dept. of Justice)

Info: provides funding to develop and implement outreach strategies targeted at, and provide victim services to, adult or youth victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking in underserved populations. Funds may be used to: develop or enhance population specific victim services; develop or enhance outreach strategies to reach underserved survivors; build the capacity of population specific organizations to serve survivors of these crimes; build the capacity of victim service providers to provide victim services that are population specific; train and educate community partners and the criminal justice system on the needs of survivors from underserved populations; and develop culturally and linguistically appropriate materials for underserved survivors.

Applicants: Nonprofit organizations that serve the Deaf and other disabilities, LGBTQ community, and religious minorities

Closing: February 27, 2023

Legal Assistance for Victims (Dept. of Justice)

Info: Grant program is intended to increase the availability of civil and criminal legal assistance needed to effectively aid adult and youth (ages 11 to 24) victims of domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, or sexual assault, by providing funds for comprehensive direct legal services to victims in legal matters relating to or arising out of that abuse or violence.

Assistance to Firefighters (AFG) Grant Program (Federal Emergency Management Administration)

Info: Provides financial assistance directly to eligible fire departments, nonaffiliated emergency medical service (EMS) organizations, and State Fire Training Academies (SFTAs) to equip and train emergency personnel to recognized standards, enhance operational efficiencies, foster interoperability, support community resilience, and enhance the safety of the public and emergency responders before, during, and after hazardous events.

Grants to Expand Substance Use Disorder Treatment Capacity in Adult & Family Drug Courts (Dept. of Health & Human Services)

Info: The purpose of this program is to expand substance use disorder (SUD) treatment and recovery support services in existing drug courts. The program recognizes the need for treatment instead of incarceration for individuals with SUDs. These awards provide a continuum of care, including prevention, harm reduction, treatment, and recovery services, for individuals with SUD involved with the courts.

Transportation & Infrastructure

Water Conservation Field Services Program (Dept. of Interior)

Info: This program provides funding for projects that result in rural water management planning. These planning projects support planning for water managers to plan, prioritize, and design projects that conserve and use water for efficiently, mitigate conflict risk in areas at a high risk of future water conflict, and accomplish other benefits that contribute to sustainability in the Western United States.

Applicants: State and Tribal governments, institutions of higher education, nonprofit organizations, individuals, and water and irrigation districts or organizations with water or power delivery authority located in Reclamation's Columbia-Pacific Northwest Region.

WaterSMART: Water Recycling & Desalination Planning (Dept. of the Interior)

Info: Program provides a framework for Federal leadership and assistance to stretch and secure water supplies for future generations in support of the Department's priorities. Rebuilding America's Infrastructure and Equity (RAISE) (Dept. of Transportation)

Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

Info: The eligibility requirements of RAISE allow project sponsors at the State and local levels to obtain funding for multi-modal, multi-jurisdictional projects that are more difficult to support through traditional DOT programs. RAISE can provide funding directly to any public entity, including municipalities, counties, port authorities, tribal governments, MPOs, or others in contrast to traditional Federal programs which provide funding to very specific groups of applicants (mostly State DOTs and transit agencies). This flexibility allows RAISE and our traditional partners at the State and local levels to work directly with a host of entities that own, operate, and maintain much of our transportation infrastructure, but otherwise cannot turn to the Federal government for support.

National Fish Passage Program (Fish & Wildlife Service)

Investment in Infrastructure & Jobs Act

Workforce Development & Education

YouthBuild (Dept. of Labor)

Info: YouthBuild is a community-based alternative education program for youth between the ages of 16 and 24 who left high school prior to graduation that also have other risk factors, including being an adjudicated youth, youth aging out of foster care, youth with disabilities, migrant farmworker youth, youth experiencing housing instability, and other disadvantaged youth populations. The YouthBuild program simultaneously addresses multiple core issues important to youth in low-income communities: affordable housing, leadership development, education, and employment opportunities in in-demand industries and apprenticeship pathways. YouthBuild programs serve as the connection point to vital services for participants. Key aspects of the YouthBuild service delivery model include meaningful partnership and collaboration with the public workforce development system, education and human services systems, and labor and industry partners. YouthBuild programs are well-positioned to connect participants with career opportunities developing as a result of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (construction), Inflation Reduction Act (clean energy), and CHIPS and Science Act (manufacturing).

National Food Safety Outreach Competitive Grants Program (Dept. of Agriculture)

Info: The program is an expansion the National Food Safety, Training, Education, Extension, Outreach,

and Technical Assistance Competitive Grants Program. Awardees will develop and implement food safety training, education, extension, outreach and technical assistance projects that address the needs of owners and operators of small to mid-sized farms, beginning farmers, socially-disadvantaged farmers, small processors, or small fresh fruit and vegetable merchant wholesalers.

[Oregon/Washington Youth Conservation Corps \(Dept. of the Interior\)](#)

Info: This opportunity is open to any qualified youth conservation corps established by a state or local government, by the governing body of any Indian tribe, or by a qualified nonprofit organization interested in working cooperatively with the OR/WA BLM to develop and administer multiple-use conservation projects. Conservation projects must focus on providing employment, education, and public-service opportunities for U.S. citizens and legal residents (between ages 16 and 30 inclusive and veterans up to age 35 inclusive) recruited from local and surrounding communities to assist with projects on public lands.
